Responsibility Statement

Please keep in mind that your conduct is a reflection of N.A. If you are unable to conduct yourself in a responsible manner, you will be asked to leave.

Shirts and shoes must be worn in all hallways and public areas at all times. Please keep in mind that not everyone stays up late and/or all night. We need to have peace and quiet in the hallways between the hours of 11:00 pm and 8:00 am. Please keep the noise level in rooms to a minimum.

Doorways: Do not block the entrances/exits to meetings.

Corridors: Do not crowd the corridors or make it difficult for others to pass.

Noise: Keep the noise level down in the corridors and meeting rooms.

Parking: Park your car only in designated areas. Do not park in fire zones. Illegally parked cars WILL BE towed away at the owner's expense.

Pool: The hotel pool is only available for registered guests.

Meetings/Workshops: Seating is available on a first-come-first-served basis. There is limited seating in all meetings and workshops.

We are obliged, by Order of the Fire Marshal, to obey seating capacities. Please do not block the aisles, move chairs, or bring in additional chairs. Violation of the Fire Marshal's orders could result in the immediate closing of the Convention. **SMOKING AND VAPING IS NOT ALLOWED IN THE HOTEL. THERE IS A \$250 FEE FOR SMOKING IN A NON-SMOKING ROOM.**

Anyone selling merchandise anywhere other than the alternative merchandise store on Sunday morning will be asked to leave this Convention. We ask all attendees to please not purchase any merchandise from people who are attempting to make money off the name of N.A. In addition, anyone who is caught distributing flyers for non-NA events will be asked to leave. This applies to all areas of the Convention, including the parking lot, hallways and hotel rooms. This Convention is not an opportunity to prey upon a captive audience who is here for the purpose for celebrating their recovery.

NOTE: If you do not have a room reservation, you CANNOT sleep in the lobby or in one of the meeting rooms. This is breaking the law and is considered theft of services. The hotel has the option to take legal action.
